Lyceum

2235 N. Sheffield, 1907. Rev. Peter V. Byrne, C.M., President. J.E.O. Pridmore, architect. Razed in 1987.

College Theatre

2219 N. Sheffield, 1907. Rev. Peter V. Byrne, C.M., President. J.E.O. Pridmore, architect. Razed in 1979. Also called "Gym" or "Barn."

Peter V. Byrne Hall

Formerly the College Building and then Academy Hall, 2219 N. Kenmore, 1907. Rev. Peter V. Byrne, C.M., President. J.E.O. Pridmore, architect.

Thomas P. Levan Center

Formerly the Liberal Arts Building, 2322 N. Kenmore, 1923. Rev. Thomas P. Levan, C.M., President. Arthur Foster, architect. Renovated 2001.

Michael J. O'Connell Building

Formerly the Hall of Science, 1036 W. Belden, 1938. Rev. Michael J. O'Connell, C.M., President. Architects: Shaw, Naess, and Murphy. Purchased on Nov. 16, 1922 from Mr. John Falle. Renovated 2001.

Wangler Hall

Located in back of the Liberal Arts and Science building (Levan), a one story frame building, 1947. Also called the Recreation Hall.

Faculty Hall

2233 N. Kenmore, 1952. Rev. Comerford J. O'Malley, C.M., President. Meyer & Cook, architects.

The Palace

1046 W. Belden, 1954. Location of Student Activities Council, Publication Office; Faculty offices were on 2nd and 3rd floors. Purchased in 1928 (the Wilson House), and used as a residence hall, "Coup Hall."

Alumni Hall

1011 W. Belden, 1956. Demolished summer of 2000. Rev. Comerford J. O'Malley, C.M., President. Naess & Murphy, architects.

The Tower

2328 N. Kenmore (next to Levan), 1963. Location of the School of Education.

Science Hall West

Also known as "The Factory" 1215 W. Fullerton, rented 1964-1980 from the Alexian Brothers.
